Annual General Meeting (AGM)

The club's AGM will take place on May 11th 2019 at 6pm at the Seaford clubhouse. The agenda is on the next page. The AGM is an opportunity to look back to 2018, and to elect the board of directors. All of the Director positions are up for election at the AGM:

Booking Events At The Galley

Chaos reigns supreme when it comes to events like group meals at The Galley. The numbers that turn-up never seem to tally with the "master" list or the money collected. Because of this we're now implementing a new system for reserving places at group meals, and the first of these will be the Commissioning Lunch on the 12th May (see flyer on the next page). From now on, the only way to book meals will be through Webcollect. You cannot purchase tickets at the clubhouse or by giving the organiser cash or cheque, and you definitely will not be able to purchase tickets after the cut-off date. You must have completed your order AND paid for the tickets by the required date (usually one week before the event) or you will not be able to attend. The advantage of this system is that you can do your bookings without having to visit the Galley. All you have to do is be mildly organised and everyone will benefit.

If you decide to pay through bank transfer you'll be advised how to do that through an e-mail. It is *critical* that you make the transfer before the cut -off date, or your order will be cancelled and you will not be able to attend.





We're All In Hot Water Now

The new hot-water system for Seaford is now in operation. This was a large investment (five figures) by the club to help to bring our facilities closer to what we'd like. We now have a centralised system consisting of two enormous hot-water tanks that are heated slowly by our existing central heating gas boiler. That allows us to deliver loads of hot water at peak demand (which couldn't be done with an on-demand system). The gentlemen amongst you will notice that there's



a partitioned-off area in the changing rooms where the system operates. So we now have all the showers in the ladies and gentlemen changing-rooms in operation, plus a reliable hot water feed to the basins in the toilets and to the Galley.

I'd hoped to supply a picture of Bill Wates (who organised all this) luxuriating in the new showers but he was a bit shy.

Laser Radial Training

We had 4 sessions planned in November, but only managed one because of too much wind, and 4 sessions planned in March and achieved 2 sessions, again because of the wind.

The training was aimed at the older sailor, although we were joined by a couple of youngsters. We concentrated on starting, upwind technique and basic boat handling.

Sailing is one of the only competitive sports where most participants spend very little time on training. Typical is 95% racing, 5% training. Compared say with athletics, which is exactly the opposite.

We are trying to change this situation, and although our time was limited, it was amazing to see the improvement, that a little bit of training gives.



I hope to organise some more training, once the boats are back in Piddinghoe Lake, probably November, keep a look out, if you want to join us.

Sailability

We are now registered as an RYA Sailability Club, and as such wish to promote sailing for those with disabilities.

However, it's obviously early days and we need to start small and build up our skills and facilities in line with the availability of volunteers who are prepared to support this activity. This interest has, I admit been brought about by the increasing disability of our daughter Jazz and the sudden realisation that access to sailing for those with disabilities in our area is poor.

We have been kindly given a Hansa 303 which is ideal for teaching on the pond so we have the ability to teach or simply give a sailing experience to disabled people, who are able to use wheel chairs and can physically get themselves into a small dinghy from a sitting position on the pontoon, with a little help from able bodied sailors. Initially the aim is to allow people of all ages who can't sail either because they are physically too weak or can't use their legs, and thus can't access the sport using a standard dinghy.

So, the next stage is to seek funding opportunities to allow us to buy suitable boats, and most importantly, identify volunteers who would be prepared to get involved, either from an admin perspective or taking people out for a sail.
