

## Our vision for the clubhouse

To restore the building so that it can be used again, we need to carry out major building works. We also want to improve accessibility to the building as well as to put better safeguarding measures in place.

- Replace the steel supports and reinstate structural integrity
- Rebuild the brickwork surrounding the steelwork
- Replace or repair the external cladding
- Replace the fire alarm system
- Improve safeguarding by adding individual cubicle partitions to the changing room areas
- Replace the wooden decking, sliding doors and external shutters
- Improve disabled access to the building

## History

In the early 1970s, NSSC raised funds to build a clubhouse on the seafront between Newhaven and Seaford.



Built on a tight budget with members' donations, the predicted lifespan was just 25 years. The simple yet strong design greatly exceeded these expectations, and lasted for 50 years! But with decades of exposure to the natural elements, the steel structure of the building ultimately corroded, and the building had to be closed in late 2023.
